

INTEGRITY POLICY – MP-SEC INTERNATIONAL AB

At MP-SEC, we care about the integrity and security of our customers.

GDPR, the legislation regarding the processing of personal data, imposes more stringent requirements on transparency, which is why it is important that this information is available to you, to ensure that you know what we do in relation to the processing of personal data. In our integrity policy, our aim is to provide clarification on the responsibilities involved, in order to protect your rights and your integrity.

WHAT IS GDPR?

GDPR stands for General Data Protection Regulation and is a new EU data protection regulation law since May 25th of 2018. The new law aims to protect the integrity of individuals and is intended to modernise, harmonise and enhance data protection within the EU.

Within each EU member state there is a supervisory authority which will check compliance with this new law. In Sweden this supervisory authority is called the Swedish Data Protection Authority (During 2018 this will change name to “the Swedish Integrity Protection Authority” and will have a slightly different role in the future).

IN GOOD HANDS

When entering a business deal with MP-SEC, you agree to let us obtain your contact details and company/business details. The data is kept and shared only within MP-SEC, select co-workers and collaborators.

We save the following personal data:

- Company name
- Point of Contact (POC)
- Delivery address/billing address
- Company phone numbers
- Company e-mail addresses.

Client data are used by us with the purpose to:

- successfully deliver your order
- facilitate further communication between us and our clients/collaborators in order to provide customer service.

As our customer, you are entitled to – at any time – request complete insight into your personal data we have stored, and choose to have it deleted/removed if you no longer want us to keep it.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

Examples of treatment that may occur for this purpose are the storage of invoice documents to fulfill our obligation under the accounting act. We will also provide your information to the Police upon request, if considered relevant to criminal investigations.

TIME CONDITIONS

Unless otherwise stated, we will keep your personal data as long as you are a customer/collaborator of ours (except when we are required by law to save them for a longer time, as stated above).

COMPLAINTS

If you believe that we treat your personal data in violation of current data protection regulations, you should report this to us as soon as possible. Furthermore, you always have the right to contact the Data Inspection Board if you have complaints regarding our processing of your personal information.
